CALYPSONIAN CRAZY (photo above), recently painted Europe red when the "lovable lunatic of calypso" gave performances there. On tour with Swedish soca band Soca Rebels, Crazy performed in four cities (Karlstad, Norrköping, Stockholm and Göteborg) with every show sold-out.

For the Göteborg concert, all tickets were sold out way in advance of the show but this didn't prevent scores of people from turning up outside the club, although they knew they wouldn't gain admission. With people banging on the doors outside, the lucky audience inside Club Magasinet lapped up all Crazy had to offer, cheering and dancing the night away until morning light. After the performance, Crazy was mobbed by adoring fans, enquiring when he would be back in town and where his records/CDs were available.

A talking point of Crazy's tour was Soca Rebels, a 10-member band comprising Swedes, Guyanese and Trinidadians. Based in Sweden, the band includes Trinidad's Trevor Phillips and Rudolph Roberts, Guyana's Michael Ferreira, and Sweden's Kars and Mats Hansson. The Hansson brothers, leading another band called Soca Jamm'rs became quite popular when they made a Swedish cover version of Crazy's "Nani Wine." The version was renamed "Farmor Svang" and remains a big hit with Swedish soca lovers.
