"I come to get first-hand knowledge of the changes you make and to get the vibes to take back home."

Lars and Mats were into pop, rock and jazz before they were bitten by the soca bug.

Now Lars composes and Mats arranges their own songs.

Their first try at soca was Crazy's "Nani Wine" back in 1990.

"I like the kicking rhythm in soca, it just makes you feel to dance," he said.

"The lyrics are such fun, of course, you have to learn about the humour, but it's fun.

"Sweden is now beginning to accept soca music and we have already had Crazy, Sparrow, Arrow and Carl & Carol Jacobs perform there," said Lars.

"There is a market for soca in Sweden and we are paving the way for your artistes.

"Soca Rebels play soca music only and we are well accepted.

"We are trying to do a recording this year.

"So far we have only done cover versions of songs but we are trying to do an album with our original composition."

Sweden has about 10 Carnivals throughout its cities and the Soca Rebels often tour the entire country.
